### Vignettes from WAGS' past . . .

What was the strangest program ever presented at WAGS? The prize would go to the 9th of April, 1976: "Finding inexpensive means of duplicating family records: a demonstration of the use of the hectograph and retail outlets for supplies."

What the heck is a hectograph? Briefly, to do hectography, you melt gelatin in glycerin; pour it in a pan and let it cool until solidified. Place your master sheet face down on the gelatin surface and let it sit. Pull up the master sheet; place blank paper on this imprinted gelatin and rub the back, and pull the sheet up. You can make multiple copies.
