What was "The Book Nook?" In 1978, LaVelle Heideman found an available storefront near Third and Rock Island Road in East Wenatchee that had been the J&B Market. It had been damaged in the 1974 Appleyard explosion, so WAGS members rolled up their sleeves and did the repairs and furnishing required. This new Book Nook housed the fledgling WAGS Library, and was open from 1:00 to 4:00 Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, as well as from 6:00 to 9:00 Tuesday evenings. The Book Nook was temporary—in March of 1979, the museum made space for our library in their annex.

meeting to make the top ten. Thank you, Brigid, you made us look soooo good!


#### **GiveNCW**

Bulletins are a thing of the past, but queries still come in to WAGS. They used to be answered by our researchers Joanne Calhoun (who has well-deservedly retired) and the late Fred Pflugrath.



We thought we'd try asking **YOU** for help! Here is a recent request for local assistance from a family outside the Wenatchee area:

We are compiling a brief biography of my brother, **Norman F. Danielson**, who grew up on an apple orchard in Sunnyslope. As a boy, Norm belonged to several organizations:

- 1) Boy Scout Troop 49 from 1946-1951/52;
- 2) Scout-A-Vista in 1949/50;
- 3) Memberships or activities during the 1946-1952 period;
- 4) Civil Air Patrol/Pangon Squadron around 1951;
- 5) Any information on a play, "Oh Susanne," or other plays at
  Wenatchee Junior College during 1952/53
  (The Wenatchee World reported on the above play in March 1953.
  Norm had the lead role and a ticket stub for February 20, 1953.)

We are having great difficulty in locating these records, and hope you will be able to help us. Thanks.
