Quick Facts:

- Part of Oregon Territory until 1853
- Statehood 11 Nov 1889
- Ranks 18th in Area/13th in Population

Important dates for vital records:

- •1891 Washington counties required by law to keep vital records
- •July 1, 1907 State takes over collecting birth and death records
- •January 1, 1968 State takes over collecting divorce and marriage records. Before 1968 you will find them at the county level

Providence Archives - http://www2.providence.org/phs/archives/Pages/default.aspx Has information on the Sisters of Providence and their activities - Institutional and corporate records, manuscripts, photographs, audiovisual materials, and artifacts document ministries in education, health care, and social services. Collections date from 1856 to the present and encompass Alaska, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, California, as well as El Salvador. The institutional records include records from

orphan's homes run by the Sisters of Providence, and may provide information such as date of birth, date and place of baptism, first communion, parents' names, where the children were placed, and more. They also have a digital archive with many photographs from different schools, hospitals and other locations. (http://providencearchives.contentdm.oclc.org/)
