



Genealogy 101

On behalf of WAGS and our partnership with the LDS FamilySearch Center for the use of their facility for our meetings and classes, and since Hank volunteers at the FSC on Wednesday nights, he has volunteered to instruct a class for WAGS members, LDS Church members, and the public

using the FSC beginning **October 4 at 7 p.m.** and continuing the first Wednesday of each month at the FamilySearch Center at 667 10th Street in East Wenatchee.

The class will cover the basics of collecting your family history information, entering it into a home computer based database of some sort like Roots Magic, Legacy, Family Tree, etc., or entering your information into an online database like Ancestry, Family Search, or others.

This is effectively a Genealogy 101 course that will consist of a lecture period—45 minutes to an hour— followed by a hands-on period using the FamilySearch Center's computers; folks can bring their own computers if they want.

Hank has volunteered at the FamilySearch Center (formerly the Family History Library or Center) on Wednesday evenings for going on 32 years and is happy to provide this service. The general public, WAGS members and friends, as well as LDS Church members are invited.

Got photos? We can help . . .

Kris McGregor recently took some old photos in for Hank to digitize and copy. Here's her story:

"I had some pictures from my grandfather's family (Jess and Elizabeth [Lizzie] Bare Jarrards). They had a farm in the Rockford, Mt. Hope and Fairfield area in Spokane County. I was especially fond of the pictures of bringing in the wheat harvest in 1915-1917. They were still using horses back then,

and I have a great picture of my grandpa in front of the chuckwagon. The photos were very mismatched in size, from 8x10s, mounted on card stock, to a postcard of my grandpa in his third grade classroom in Rockford in 1907.

Hank digitized them with his camera, worked to standardize the size, and then downloaded them onto my flashdrive (the quality is excellent). Now they can be blown up, still keeping an amazing amount of detail. I didn't even know Grandpa Jess was in one of the pictures until I zoomed in on it, and there he was by the horses!

I have found more pictures that will be digitized and added to the flashdrive. One is of a Christmas tree in their front parlor—I should be able to zoom in and get a close-up of the pictures on the back wall. I have four tintypes of the gr-gr-grandparents on my mother's side that I'll also have digitized."
