- •The Foundation also provides lots of giving incentives and matching opportunities.

A couple reminders . . .

Fred Meyer Rewards: Sign up for a **Fred Meyer Rewards Card** and designate WAGS as your beneficiary. We will get a small percentage of every purchase you make. It all adds up! Go to https://www.fredmeyer.com/account/create/.

Renew your WAGS membership: First, check your membership status under Members Only/Membership Account, and discover your expiration date. Then click Join or Renew on the lower part of your screen and choose an online payment or a mail-in form. Or come in during library hours and we'll help you renew your membership.

WAGS Tutorial: Making Friends with the WAGS Digital Archive

First, log in to our website (<u>www.wags-web.org</u>) as a member.

On the home page, on the left, click on **Research Records**.

A menu will drop down, and you'll click on **Digital Archive of Searchable Records.**



The next page says **Search the WAGS Digital Image Archive**, and you are given two choices:

- 1. If you didn't sign in as a member, you would use **Free Search Public Use.** It would take you to the Search page, and you would enter your search terms. However, you would only get to see snippets of what is found. This would give you an idea of what we have, and you could decide if we have records that interest you. You cannot access any images on a Free Search—only the snippets (some call them "teasers").
- 2. **Paid Search Members Only** Oh no! Do I have to pay something? No! As a WAGS member, your dues make you "paid." You will be able to view and print the digital images.

So off we go on our well-deserved **Paid Search.** First, you'll see a page called **Digital Archive Paid Search Member Check** which is something the computer program wants to do to make sure you are a member. Go ahead and click on **Paid Search Page** – **Members Only.**

Now you have arrived at **WAGS Digital Archive Search Results.** You'll click on one of the small dots. Let's make sure we're clear on the different kinds of searches:

AND search: The program will look for all the keywords you have entered. Not in order,

necessarily, and not together, necessarily. If I were to enter <u>Fred Rumble</u> on an AND search, for instance, I'd get every Fred and every rumble seat and every description of the sound of a thunder storm it could find! Maybe better to use a phrase search:

PHRASE search: In the old days, this was where we would put our search terms in quotes. Now quotes are not necessary, and you'll just click on the small dot. The program will look for exactly those words in exactly that order. This is probably the best way to search for names.

OR search: The program will look for one or more keywords, but not necessarily all.

Tolerant search: Of course we want our computers to be tolerant of our human frailties. But a Tolerant Search is for foreign language searching where there are accents, umlauts, etc. (diacritical marks, they call them). The program will not tolerate more than one word.

Now that you understand, select the kind of search you want, and type your search terms in the white field at the top that says **Query** and hit the **Search** button next to it. And your results will be shown!

The first line that you see is numbered, and starts at the left margin. That's the page the program has found. Below that, indented, are your snippets. All the snippets below the numbered page will be found on that page. Then you'll see the next page (if any), numbered and on the left margin, with its little brood of snippets. And on and on.

You may click on any of the pages and see what you've got. If you'd like to see the page before or after, here's what to do: go to the address bar at the top of your browser and change the page number that is in parentheses (at the end of the url); then hit the enter key and that page will be shown (if it exists). This way you can view or print adjacent pages such as from a bulletin or book.

The names of the results pages are given and briefly explained back on the **Search the WAGS Digital Image Archive** page. Click on the skinny bar that says **Click this button to see what is included in the Digital Archive.**

And now you know the basics of finding things on the WAGS Digital Archive!
