


WAGS President's Letter January 2024



public and private archives, genealogy associations, ethnic specialists and internet sites, as well as real-life research notes for learning through the experiences of others.

For sale: "We Left Because the Creek Went Dry," The People of the First Creek District, Lake Chelan, Washington, 1888-1932 by Elizabeth Watson Perry. Formerly a member of the Lake Chelan Gen. Society, Ms. Perry is the great-granddaughter and goddaughter of two early First Creek settlers. She has done an excellent job of researching the old families and collecting early photographs, and her writing style is engaging. Even if you have no Chelan people in your tree, you'll enjoy this book, and gain inspiration for your own writing. A steal at \$5.00.

For sale: Fourth Edition of Sir Richard Musgrave's **Memoirs of the Irish Rebellion of 1798.** Musgrave's original work was published in 1801. This new edition sports a new, 10,600-entry index, making it an important genealogical resource. This book originally belonged to our late-but-fondly-remembered member Lynda Pheasant. I'm guessing she wanted it for research on her Philips family. I can't lie to you—it's a thick book, full of detail on this turbulent time in Irish history. But if you are an Irish history nerd (a

person who is extremely enthusiastic and knowledgeable about a particular subject), then you won't believe you scored this volume for just \$5.00.
