- James J. Hill (The Empire Builder)
- Official completion was at Scenic, Washington, on January 6, 1893.
- Wellington disaster was on a Great Northern Line
- Original G.N. route was from Spokane to Wenatchee through Steven's Pass to Everett
- Skykomish Historical Society—good resource for Great Northern in Central Washington
- NRM owns 6 rail cars related to the Great Northern
